Hohenwerfen Fortress: A journey back to the Middle Ages

Hohenwerfen Castle perches majestically atop a lofty rock peak, far above Salzachtal valley. Trained birds of prey circle the towers, while those who pass through these mighty walls enter another world. This is an experience of the Middle Ages for all the senses. Hohenwerfen Fortress is one of the most popular family destinations in the entire province of Salzburg.

The Legend of Jackl: Witches and Wizards in Salzburg

'The Legend of Jackl – Wizards and Witches in Salzburg' is a special exhibition highlight on every visit to the castle that immediately became a visitor magnet. It's dedicated to a craftsman and bandit leader from Werfen – Jakob Tischler (a.k.a. Jakob Koller), better known as 'Jackl the Wizard'. Visitors discover a world of witches and wizards on a total of four floors of the ancient armoury building. The display deals with the occurrences at the centre of the Salzburg witch trials, through to today's cults of magic around the world. The exhibition fascinates visitors with authentic and very spooky exhibits, multimedia installations and fairy-tale characters.

Experience the Middle Ages up close

Hohenwerfen Fortress has plenty more to offer than stories of legendary magicians, witches and wizards. One major highlight is a guided **tour of the fortress**. Guests are immersed in the history of the building and discover many a spine-chilling detail from long ago. The torture chamber with its terrifying dungeon was once inhabited by a mute prisoner. From high up in the bell tower there's a wonderful view of Salzburg's mountain scenery, inviting visitors to take photos and marvel at the view. The tour for foreign-language visitors is offered with an **audio guide in 13 languages**. After the tour, the **castle tavern restaurant** tempts guests with regional specialties and medieval delicacies.

Historic birds of prey at close range

One special highlight of every visit is a **falconry demonstration** staged by the **old provincial falconry centre**. Demonstrations in the fortress grounds are held twice a day, and even three times a day in July

Mai bis September: täglich 9 - 17 Uhr 15. Juli bis 16. August: täglich 9 - 18 Uhr and August. Visitors come to the fortress from all over the world to witness the spectacular aerial ma-

noeuvres performed by falcons, eagles, buzzards and other birds of prey at close quarters. Trained fal-

conry specialists and the **falconry museum** provide insights into an ancient craft rarely seen today.

A medieval fortress becomes a family attraction

Hohenwerfen Fortress has enjoyed a highly eventful past. Under Archbishop Gebhard von Helfenstein,

in 1077 construction commenced in parallel with the building of Hohensalzburg Fortress and of Friesach

Castle in Carinthia. Great rulers and regional sovereigns were imprisoned in the castle. During its col-

ourful history the mighty Hohenwerfen Fortress has also served as a film location and a police training

college, ultimately being opened up for visitors from around the world 30 years ago. Since then, the for-

tress has become one of the most popular tourist attractions in the province of Salzburg.

Perfect for families

Hohenwerfen Fortress is particularly great for families. A special children's audio guide is available in

six languages (German, Italian, English, Dutch, Danish and Hebrew) to ensure all kids enjoy entertain-

ing, depictive and informative insights into life in the Middle Ages. Kids can go off on a thrilling treasure

hunt equipped with a notebook as they participate in the **children's riddle rally**. Those who solve all

the riddles, and find all the items, can look forward to a treat in the castle shop.

Events: Always something going on at the castle

As every year, in 2024 Hohenwerfen Castle will be staging a wide variety of events. Highlights include

the atmospheric Christmas market in December, the mystical nights (17th May, 5th July, 23rd August

& 20th September) - when guests sit around the burgrave's table, the **summer cinema** on 9th August

and the **Pongau Fortress Singing Festival** on 29th June. There's plenty scheduled for families, too,

such as the grand children's party (6th October), Medieval Activities (18th – 20th May, 6th & 7th July,

24th & 25th August & 21st & 22nd September), featuring jugglers, artisans and knights, the special fal-

conry programme with authentic hunting music from down the centuries (17th & 18th August), and court

and hunting music (June 15th & 16th, July 13th & 14th & September 14th & 15th). Numerous new event

formats are also being planned for 2024, such as a storytelling theatre day, castle concerts and read-

Getting here & purchasing tickets

Hohenwerfen Castle is just 30 minutes from Salzburg on the motorway. S-Bahn trains run every half

hour between the city of Salzburg and the village of Werfen. The journey takes around 45 minutes.

From Werfen railway station, visitors can either walk approximately 30 minutes, or book a shuttle bus to

Hohenwerfen Fortress an hour before arrival by calling +43 664 1266700. There's a lift up to the fortress

from the car park below. Alternatively, visitors can follow the *Vogeltennweg* path up to the peak on foot.

The ascent takes around 30 minutes. Hohenwerfen Fortress can be explored free-of-charge with the

'SalzburgerLand Card' or time can be saved by purchasing an **online ticket** on smartphones or laptops.
